From Deputy Principal

NCCD: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education This data is used as the basis for national funding. The NCCD involves the collection of:

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students
- student's type of disability if known Under the model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection. Term1 PE Overview



Hi everyone,

Welcome back for 2020! The first term back is always busy in PE, with a number of events scheduled throughout the later part of the term. The content we will be covering in PE lessons is to help prepare and familiarise all students for the events.

RECEPTION-YR 2 and UP/JP Special Ed: This term we will be practising fundamental movement skills such as locomotion (movement), throwing/catching, kicking and striking with implements using circuits and games for the first half of the term. In the 2nd half of the term, our focus will shift to practicing our tabloid games for Sports Day, so students are familiar with these activities and can be successful with them on the day.

YR 3-6: This term we will be practising various athletics events (such as high jump, long jump, discus, shot put, 100m, 200m and 800m) in preparation for SAPSASA District Athletics Day. Please remember that to be eligible for selection, your child must be Yr 4-6 and turning 10 or older this year. In the 2nd half of the term, our focus will shift to practising our tabloid games for Sports Day, so students are familiar with these activities and can be successful with them on the day.

Japanese – Term 1 Overview

Konnichiwa (Hello),

Each week on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Years 3/4 students have a total of 100 minutes of Japanese learning and Rec, 1/2, 5/6, Pri. Sp. Ed. and J.P Sp. Ed. students have one 50 minute lesson. The Japanese classroom is located in the Upper Primary Unit.

When the students come to the Japanese room they will learn:

- the first Japanese alphabet, which is called *Hiragana*, because knowing this alphabet is <u>crucial</u> for learning the Japanese Language as set out in the National Curriculum
- identify/recognise the three different Japanese scripts, Hiragana, Kanji and Katakana
- to say and trace/write Japanese words, phrases, questions and sentences
- about Japanese culture/festivals
- songs and play games (to learn new language)
- to make origami (paper folding) and do a variety of Japanese craft activities on selected topics

Years 3/4 and 5/6 students will have regular **tests** on the Japanese alphabets.


Change of School and Kindy Name

So, we are asking for our communities' feedback as to what would be an appropriate name for us both. There is a strict criteria for naming schools/ kindys which is below, so you have an understanding of this before offering your suggestions. Please can you have a read and provide your feedback to Governing Council by **Friday 20**th **March.** If you have any questions or want more information please ask.

Criteria for choosing a suitable name

Any one of the following selection criteria have been approved as the basis for choosing a suitable name:

- The official suburb/township/locality name (with a directional indicator if there is more than one school of the same area) with the appropriate school category (preferred option)
- The name of the road on which the school is located
- Names of places with historical connections with the area serviced by the school (e.g early homestead names), unless there is a conflict with an existing suburb/township/locality name or another place with the same name
- Names honouring relevant South Australian citizens (which are to include both the given and surname
 of the person). If a school is to be named after a person, a direct, a direct relationship between the
 school and that person must be demonstrated (eg ethos or geographical location). Evidence that
 direct descendants were consulted and support the naming proposal also needs to be provided.
- The Aboriginal name of a local geographical feature or a word or words that reflects a theme that is related to the educational outcomes or cultural foci of the school.
